### Computer Systems & Website Upgrades-

Last month we entered into an agreement with Hailey based Clear Mind Graphics to upgrade the functionality of our website, streamline processes for SVEA staff and introduce an Owner Portal for our members. We also began work with Ally systems (SVEA's primary system) to create the financial and account data connections between the website and our Ally system. members this Spring. We know that many homeowners are struggling to keep their homes insured because of our rural location and the history of nearby wildfires. SVEA's first action will begin this spring to clear brush and grass from the open space access corridors. Tom Kling will co-chair this committee along with Jeff Mihalic. Tom Eklund will join as committee member along with select board members and members of the community.

Robust Balance Sheet- We will continue to build our financial reserves to avoid any future requirement for a loan or a special assessment. We are establishing an investment account to hold these operating and capital reserves, primarily investing in Treasuries and CD's to deliver reasonable returns with minimal risk to principal in accordance with our financial policies. A portion of your dues goes to fund these reserves, and we will exercise the proper due diligence to invest your funds wisely.

Given these priorities for 2025, we have realigned our committees as follows:

<u>Recreation</u>- The scope of the Recreation Committee has been expanded to include all of Elkhorn's open space as well as the open space access corridors. Marlene Fletcher will co-chair this committee along with Pete Peterson. Tom Kling will join as committee member along with selected members from our community.

<u>Elkhorn Community Vision</u>- The board has established a new committee to focus on the longer-term vision for our community and deliver an updated Master Amenity Plan. This effort will include actions that help to preserve Elkhorn's unique character and build our sense of community. Scott Pertel and Marlene Fletcher will co-chair this important new committee along with selected committee members from our board and engagement with our homeowners.

<u>Water Conservation</u>- This Committee has been eliminated because Sun Valley Water & Sewer has asked to speak at our board meetings and provide information to SVEA homeowners via our Newsletters. Their direct participation makes our water conservation committee redundant.

<u>Village Core Parking & Annexation Committee</u>- We have formed a new committee for the purpose of executing agreements between the stakeholders. Clark Furlow has agreed to chair this committee, continuing the efforts already underway. Clark will chair this committee and Tom Kling will join him as committee member.

<u>Communications Committee</u>- This committee will now routinely coordinate with the City of Sun Valley to capture important information for inclusion into our Newsletters, seeking input from SV Administration, SV Water, and SV Fire & Police Departments. Our goal is to consistently provide relevant information that is of interest to our homeowners.

As a final note, I am very grateful for the tireless efforts of our SVEA staff... our General Manager Linda Horensavitz, Office Administrator Korionna Brune, Finance Director Sue Kwapick, ADC Manager Sue Ahern, and Operations Manager Mark Lube. Since joining us this summer, Linda has rapidly engaged herself in SVEA affairs and has already begun to expand the team's skills and capabilities. ## BOARD APPROVES RENTAL AMENITY ACCESS CHANGES AS OF May 1<sup>st</sup>, 2025

## **Amenity Access Rules**

There are three conditions placed on the use of the recreational amenities in Elkhorn as follows:

- 1) Everyone, 5 and older, entering an amenity location **must** have an amenity card.
- 2) An amenity card holder may bring up to 5 guests to the pools and hot tubs who do not possess an amenity pass; however, there is a **\$10** fee for each person without an amenity pass.
- 3) Anyone residing in an Elkhorn home or condominium on a long or short-term basis qualifies for an amenity card or guest pass. If you are not staying in Elkhorn, and not a property owner, you are not entitled to an amenity pass.

To avoid the frustration of being turned away, please bring your amenity pass every time you visit an Elkhorn amenity. We thank you for your cooperation and understanding.

Winter in the Idaho mountains brings a special beauty and the excitement of cold-weather, outdoor activities. Your Board and Staff take this opportunity to remind you of the dangers of thin ice. The many ponds and waterways in Elkhorn and the surrounding areas provide fun recreation. However, as everyone knows thin ice can be hazardous. Please be cautious and carefully supervise your children and pets, and remind your out-of-town guests of the danger.

**Pets:** Please clean up after pets and properly dispose of waste bags. SVEA continues to receive this as the most frequently reported complaint.

Snow Plowing: Please remember to ask your snow removal contractor to plow all driveway snow onto your property. Plowing snow into road right-of-way is not permitted and could lead to fines issued by the City. As a matter of common courtesy please don't plow snow onto neighboring property without permission.

**Wildlife**: Observe wildlife at a safe distance. We are fortunate to have amazing creatures to observe. Please keep a distance for your own safety and avoid adding undue stress to the animals.

# Safe Ash Disposal

- If possible, allow ashes to cool for several days in the fireplace, wood stove, grill, or firepit where you had the fire. These devices are designed to safely contain heat and flames. Recommended cooling time in the burn location is at least four days. Even if you think the fireplace or stove is completely cooled, wear fire resistant gloves when handling it and the ashes.
- When it's time to remove the ashes, transfer them to a metal or earthenware container with an air-tight, non-flammable lid.
- Once the ashes are in the container, put the lid on securely and set it outside
  your home on a non-combustible surface at least ten feet away from any
  combustibles until all ashes inside have fully cooled (wait at least a week). You're
  keeping the ash can away from combustibles because any heat in the ashes can
  transfer itself to the metal container and from there to nearby combustible
  surfaces
- If you need to dispose of ashes without waiting a full week, you can speed up the
  cooling process by adding water to the container and stirring it into the ashes
  until no dry pockets remain.
- Do not place any combustible materials in the metal container with the ashes.
- Do not use a combustible container for storing ash (wood, plastic, and cardboard are all very bad ideas).
- Do not put your ash container on or near anything that is capable of catching fire.
- Do not use a regular vacuum cleaner or shop vac to clean out your wood or pellet stove (unless you haven't burned in it for weeks).
   Only fire resistant vacuum cleaners designed for that purpose can be used safely.
